For 2019/20, Pupil Premium grants have been set at a range of levels depending on the age of the children. The eligibility for the basic levels of Pupil Premium is known as Ever 6 Free School Meals (FSM) to include pupils who are known to be eligible for FSM at any point since May 2012.

In 2018-19, just over one million (23%) primary school students in England were eligible for Pupil Premium funding and in secondary schools there were 802,545 (35%) Pupil Premium-eligible pupils. The pupil premium is additional funding for publicly funded schools in England to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils and close the gap between them and their peers Pupil premium funding is available to: local authority maintained schools, including special schools and pupil referral units (PRUs)

Pupil Premium - Nottingham Schools

The government is making it a requirement that details of the Pupil Premium will need to be recorded in the PEP and how it addresses their educational needs This will make the local authority and schools more accountable. Schools can expect Ofsted to look in detail how the Pupil Premium is spent for individual children in care.

Pupil Premium Plus - ePEP

The Pupil Premium gives schools extra funding to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils from reception to year 11. Students are identified as being disadvantaged if they are classed as having or have had in the last 6 years a deprived background (identified if you qualify or have qualified in the last 6 years for free school meals)

The premium is provided in order to support these students to enable them to reach their full potential.

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
