- An adult bearded dragon minimally requires a 238 L vivarium although a larger enclosure is recommended.
- A screen top is recommended to allow proper ventilation, prevent escape and protect your dragon from other pets.

Bearded Dragons are omnivorous. They eat almost anything—insects, snails and slugs, even other lizards and dead animals, and also fruit, greens, vegetables, and flowers. Bearded Dragons get water from their food, and from dew, mist, and rain. Dragons are also good swimmers, with some coastal species more accustomed to swimming than others.

Lighting/Heat. It is recommended that you supply a day-night cycle for your Central Bearded Dragon of 12 hours of light and 12 hours of darkness but adjusting this cycle to match natural cycles is also possible and may contribute to more natural behaviours.

### **Central Bearded Dragon Care Sheet - Herpvet**

Bearded Dragons require full spectrum lighting for 12-14 hours a day. Reptisun 10.0 or Arcadia 12% tubes are known to provide some of the best full UVB for your dragons. The coils or compacts of the same brand aren't recommended, as they have shown to cause eye problems and reduction of appetite.

Bearded dragons come from the dry, arid regions of Australia. They typically eat native insects and vegetation and receive water from little rainfall, dew, and what comes from plants, such as cactus. It is important to replicate their native environment when kept in captivity.

Of these, the inland or central bearded dragon is the most widely kept lizard of the species. Bearded dragons live in very hot and very dry climates. Most of their hydration comes from the plants and vegetables that they consume. They like to soak in water bowls. Adult bearded dragons are very territorial.
