2016 Revisions to the CTAS Guidelines. Since 2006, CTAS has been reviewed and revised on a 4-year cycle. The 2016 revisions have added 3 new CEDIS complaints, integrated components of the Obstetrical Triage and Acuity Scale (OTAS) to align our obstetrical special modifiers where possible and added a postpartum complaint.

CTAS Publications

In order to give a patient a. CTAS score of 4 or 5, blood pressure and heart rate must be within normal limits for age. A CTAS score of 3, means the patient's blood pressure and heart rate are within normal limits but are at thehigh or low limits of normal with no apparent signs of hemodynamic compromise.

The Canadian Triage and Acuity Scale (CTAS) was first developed for use in Canadian hospital emergency departments (ED) as a tool to help define a patient's need for care. CTAS assists hospital staff to assign a level of acuity for patients based on the presenting complaint and the type and severity of their presenting signs and symptoms.

Prehospital Canadian Triage & Acuity Scale

Triage algorithms for obstetric acuity to assess and assign priority to obstetric patients may be useful. Women should be cared for according to triage acuity rather than by time of arrival. The Emergency Severity Index was designed by the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality to triage nonpregnant adults and has been adopted by many emergency departments 8 .

Triage Drift Concept of "normalization toward the mean" The knowledge that a patient will need to be assigned to the waiting room, may lead the triage nurse to "uptriage" a CTAS 4 or 5 patient in the hopes of shortening their wait Similarly there may be subconscious pressure to "downtriage" certain patients based on ED space

THE CANADIAN TRIAGE AND ACUITY SCALE

Hospitals have incorporated triage principles into the practice of OB by either establishing stand-alone OB triage units or creating triage areas adjacent to the L&D department. 13 Qualified nursing personnel, including nurse-midwives, nurse practitioners, and clinical nurse specialists often staff these units. Typically, laboring patients who present to obstetric triage are assessed and transferred to the L&D department.

Triage is the process of collecting pertinent information about patients who are seeking emergency care and initiating a decision-making procedure that uses a valid and reliable triage acuity designation system.1 Rapid and accurate triage decisions are important for successful emergency department (ED)

Triage Qualifications and Competency

The use of CTAS in obstetric triage is limited as it only includes a small number of higher acuity modifiers. 3 OTAS is based on the 5-category (1-Resusitative, 2-Emergent, 3-Urgent, 4-Less Urgent, 5-Nonurgent) CTAS scale but developed with a comprehensive list of obstetric modifiers. The IRR of CTAS has been studied using clinical vignettes.

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
