Dispensation of justice to juveniles

The study of India's Juvenile Justice Act of 1986, Juvenile Justice Act of 2000, and the Juvenile Justice Act of 2015; and Bangladesh's Children Act of 2013 suggest that India and Bangladesh have made considerable progress in harmonizing the rules and principles of juvenile justice with those of the American model, the CRC, and the concept of child-friendly justice.

Since their independence from the Soviet Union, the five countries of Central Asia - Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan and Uzbekistan - have made progress towards establishing juvenile justice systems in line with international standards.

JUVENILE JUSTICE IN CENTRAL ASIA - IPJJ

Europe, the Middle East, Asia and South America have modified their juvenile justice system to treat the child as an individual, rather than a responsibility of the state. European and Scandinavian laws and court systems began to reflect a change to a welfare and justice model for youth entering the juvenile justice system.

The Asia-Pacific Council for Juvenile Justice (APCJJ) was launched by the International Juvenile Justice Observatory (IJJO) in 2012, with the objective of promoting child-friendly justice reforms and advocacy according to the priorities and challenges in the region.

ADDRESSING JUVENILE JUSTICE PRIORITIES IN THE ASIA-PACIFIC ...

Most South Eastern European countries/territories are undertaking actions aimed at reforming the juvenile justice systems, which, however, still have to yield to concrete results so as to ensure the full respect of the rights of children in conflict with the law and at risk. There is a common understanding on the necessity of revising legislations in place, particularly by boosting the establishment of specialized courts/bodies at all levels of the justice system.

UNODC South Eastern Europe on Juvenile Justice

The approach ensured that juvenile justice encompassed both children who committed crimes and, importantly in the modern Japanese context, children who were vulnerable or at risk. Over time, this inevitably caused tension as at-risk children remained within a justice jurisdiction (Vito, 2011, p. 19).

Juvenile Offenders who are convicted will have a permanent criminal record unless the Court grants Youth Offender status. Juvenile Offender cases can be transferred to Family Court if the Court determines that the transfer would be in the interests of justice. Upon transfer to Family Court, the child is then considered a Juvenile Delinquent.
